Pray: Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

"For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birthpangs." (Mark 13:8)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

A disciple was adoring the grand appearance of the temple, but Jesus declared to him that the temple would come to its destruction. When his disciples inquired him about the sign of such destruction, Jesus exhorted them to be alert to the confusion and calamities that would take place in the future.



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household.

- What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?
- What is the most magnificent piece of architecture that you've experienced? What made it special? How is it significant to you?
- Where do you think God is leading your life? Will there be twists and turns? Will there be inspiration and direction?
- For the littles: What's the biggest building you've ever been in? Did you like it?
