Use this resource at home to guide your household's daily devotions.



Pray: Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

God of all truth, your thoughts are well beyond our own. Challenge us to look beyond our narrow assumptions, into a wider vision of how the world could be, for the sake of Jesus Christ. Amen.



Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

Pilate asked him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." (John 18:37)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

When Pilate asked him about his kingship, Jesus asserted that his kingdom did not belong to or originate from this world but that he was born to this world to testify to the truth.



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household.

- What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?
- What is truth?
- How does the imagery of Christ as king speak to you? What other images of Christ speak to you?
- For the littles: Describe Jesus' kingdom.



Bless: Close your devotion with a blessing.

May Christ the King bless your days. Amen.

Pay attention to the media you absorb this week. Take time to absorb media with an opposing viewpoint. How much of what you take in is truth, and how much is perspective? Are there things you hold to be true that may not be?
