Use the story on the first page to help you fill in the crossword puzzle.

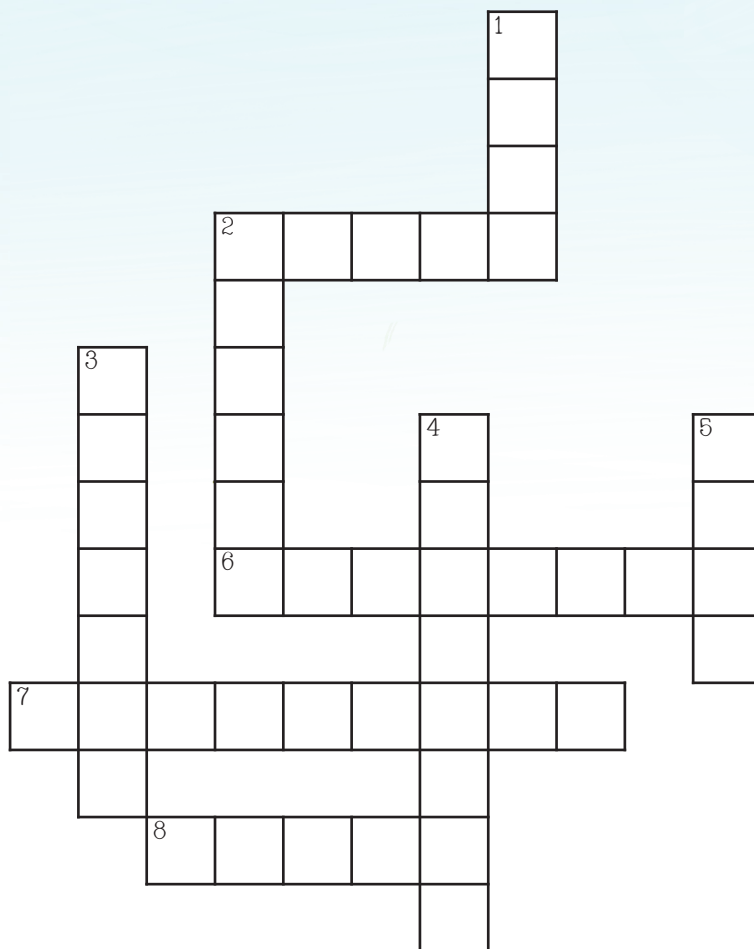
Jesus' friends lived together in **[7 ACROSS]**. But sometimes they were **[1 DOWN]** to each other.
