




## August 29, 2021 Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

## Use this resource at home to guide your household's daily devotions.




O God, you know what we carry in our inmost hearts. Fill us with the things which promote life, and purge us of all that distorts and defiles from within, for the sake of Jesus our Lord. Amen.



Read: Read the key verses from Sunday's reading.

Then he called the crowd again and said to them, "Listen to me, all of you, and understand: there is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile, but the things that come out are what defile." (Mark 7:14-15)



Jesus could see that the rites and rituals being performed had fallen far from God's intent for God's people. Jesus demanded that they stop over-attending to external things, and begin attending to the internal things that defile.



**Connect:** Connect in conversation with others in your household or community.

What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?


Words can hurt. Think of a story that was reported unfairly. Did it cause division? What would it take for people to unlearn the lie and relearn the truth?
