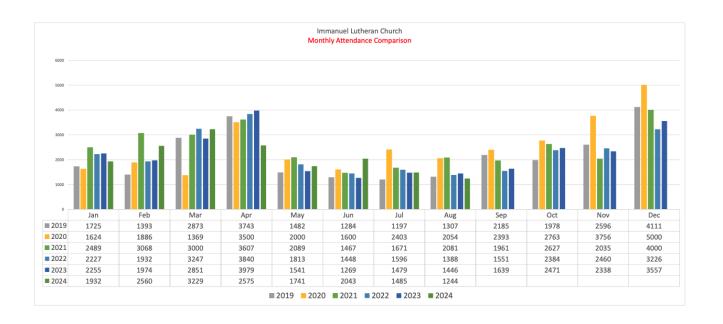

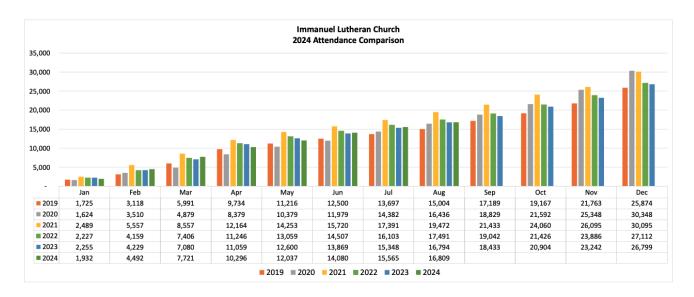

Attendance - Rick I.

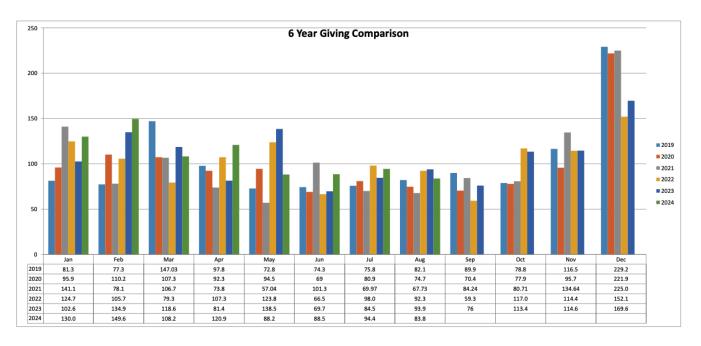
- August comparable to last year

Financials - Connie C.

- 83.7k income for August a little below budget. Currently at 58.5k budget deficit Year to Date, but feeling good for the year, especially since last quarter of year usually has strongest giving
- Still about 4 months in reserve, which is normal
- Member giving 50k above target for Year to Date. September is the lowest forecasted month, but off to a good start. If it goes well, this could be the first year at Immanuel without a month below 80k
- Program expenses negative for August due to a change in accounting methods. This
 represents things like collecting Sunday School fee now that won't be spent until later in the
 year
- Some of our income is coming from interest, which is nice
- Waiting for refund on insurance, so that will be a boost when it comes. New church-based insurance org called Insurance Board is providing better coverage for a lot less
- We previously loaned money to the Raise the Roof fund (from the general fund) so we could start the projects earlier, but now that we have collected many of the donations we are close to getting that all repaid
- Expenditures on Raise the Roof include roofing, bathrooms, computers, Simpson House, Habitat for Humanity

STAFF UPDATES

Kelly M.

- Enjoying the good energy from staff this fall, and fun to have everyone back in meetings.
- Health Insurance Benefits and updates to the Employee Guidebook were approved in Executive meeting today. Improvements in process and documentation.
- Executive Council also voted to approve and close the 2022 and 2023 financial books.
 Improved training and processes going forward. More detailed notes are in the Executive meeting minutes.
- The audit team roles were defined and documented in accordance with synod rules.

MINISTRY TEAM UPDATES

Pastor Paul

- one funeral and two baptisms in August.
- Big effort went to Welcome Weekend. Call for helping set up for Bingo. More people came to help than expected, and many people also stepped up to do the take down after the tent meeting. About \$2.900 raised by Bingo event. Staff works well together, dreams well together, and each adds their own strength.
- Walk-through of New Testament will be Wed night adult education this fall.
- Tomorrow night and Sunday, transition meeting listening session. Julie M. gave the council a
 quick preview of possible processes and timelines for the staff transitions ahead. The overall
 takeaways are that it will take a while, we have a lot of time, and there are a lot of possible
 paths. Listening sessions to get input from the congregation are the start.

Pastor Dan

- At the end of the month, there will be a discussion opportunity called Newspaper Prayers, which will be somewhat similar to highs and lows, but in response to things in the media. How do we respond faithfully and prayerfully to news items that make us angry? Bringing back treats Sundays once a month on the same week as Newspaper Prayers.
- Pastor Dan spoke about transitions.
 - Pastor Dan has experienced transition and interim processes in a number of contexts and roles. He pointed out that each transition situation needs to be addressed individually because each situation is unique. Some consistencies in transition include a period of mourning and feelings of anxiety within the community. Doing the call process faster won't help these things.

On the plus side, transition provides a great opportunity, especially for a healthy congregation like Immanuel, to do visioning. The visioning process can and should be life-giving and exciting. The first part is to articulate what we want from the next Senior Pastor. This should not be personality based; it should be based on what the congregation identifies as anticipated goals and needs over the next several years. Once we have the vision, we can work toward calling a Senior Pastor whose passions and gifts align with what the congregation seeks.

Pastor Dan mentioned that having an Associate Pastor become a Senior Pastor is not a common path within the ELCA. However, Pastor Paul mentioned that we do have a precedent for this happening within our church in the case of Pastor Paul's call. In any case, there are processes to follow including creation of a Call Committee.

One possible path would involve calling an interim pastor, and Kelly M. pointed out that even if we ended up having an interim pastor, the work of the congregation would not pause, because we have strong systems including teams led by lay people.

Pastor Dan has not yet expressed whether or not he is interested in being considered for the Senior Pastor role. Pastor Dan encouraged us to do robust visioning sessions FIRST without regard to whether Pastor Dan is interested in being a candidate for the position. For one thing, knowing what the congregation is seeking in a Senior Pastor is helpful to anyone considering the position.

Although being in transition and having many decisions to make can be unsettling, Pastor Dan believes that identifying congregational needs and vision comes first, and there is no need to rush things.

Deacon Savannah

- Excited about Truth and Healing group that started this summer, which has been learning
 about indigenous history, and exploring ways to go beyond just a performative land
 acknowledgement. Attended Pow Wow and Red Rock talk. Will go to the Arboretum and check
 out Rice Lake. Thinking about how to bring learnings back to the Immanuel community.
- Started Service & Justice committee. It will fall under Social Concerns.

Properties - Mark A.

- New tree donated by Jon & Jody Ebert
 - The Innova tree was developed at the UofM and is a cross between the Native Eastern Cottonwood and European Black Poplar. It is cottonless, seedless and will get up to 75 ft tall.
 - Decided on a location on the south end of the outdoor stage. Jon and Mark will plant on 9/12.
 - The three existing wooden posts in that area previously used for a shade tent for the outdoor stage have been removed.
