



## Baptism of the Lord

## **January 10, 2021** Mark 1:4-11

Use this resource at home to guide your household's daily devotions.



**Pray:** Light a candle. Open your devotion with prayer.

O God, you poured out your Spirit upon your only Son, showing the people that he belonged to you. Send this same Spirit to us as a sign of our baptism and belonging as your beloved children, in the name of Jesus our brother. Amen.



**Read:** Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

"I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." (Mark 1:8)



Jesus' ministry began with the voice of a prophet and a meaningful baptism. Then he was driven out into the world, where he gathered his community.



**Connect:** Connect in conversation with others in your household or community.

What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?

Has the world ever confused a prophet (or assistant) for the actual leader? How did it impact the group?

Do you know the story of your baptism? Can you remember it? Who was there? Was it a mystical experience, or was it pointing the way for something more?

For the littles: Have your family tell you about your baptism, or talk about when it will happen!



**Bless:** Close your devotion with a blessing.

You are filled with the Holy Spirit and loved forever. Amen.

**Do:** By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.

Remind yourself of the blessedness of your baptism. Every time you wash hands, dishes, or take a bath with clean water, make the sign of the cross on your forehead to remember you are baptized with the Holy Spirit.
