Pray: Light a candle. Open your devotion with prayer.

Read: Read the key verses from Sunday's reading.

⁶¹Another said, "I will follow you, Lord; but let me first say farewell to those at my home."⁶²Jesus said to him, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God." (Luke 9:61-62)



Jesus was distracted by the coming events in Jerusalem. Soon he would be facing his own death.



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household or community.

What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?

What do you find is the most difficult thing about following Jesus? What is the easiest?

For the littles: Do you like playing the game, "follow the leader"? Would you rather be the leader or the follower? Why?

Bless: Close your devotion with a blessing.

Do: By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.

Do a role reversal. Select a project (home repair, art, accounting, etc.) you are used to doing with more than one person. If you are normally a leader, try backing off and letting someone else take the lead. If you are normally a follower, step up and take control. How does the switch affect your perspective?
