CONGREGATIONAL MEETING JUNE 23. Our Church Council has voted to transfer ownership of the single-family home in Eden Prairie to Onward Eden Prairie. This home was originally purchased through gifts of an anonymous donor, along with \$100,000 from the Building Up Capital Campaign. This allowed Onward to begin their non-profit providing stable housing & support for homeless young adults in Eden Prairie. Transferring this asset to Onward will allow them the stability to purchase another property and grow! A congregational vote is required to complete this asset transfer. TRUTH AND HEALING TABLE. In the past year our church body, the ELCA, has initiated the "Truth & Healing Movement" as an intentional opportunity for the church to increase it's understanding of our colonizing impacts on Indigenous people in the past and present. The movement is focused on providing opportunities to learn the true, and largely ignored, history and current realities of Indigenous people with the hope that by listening and learning, these truths will bring healing for both Indigenous and non-Indigenous people alike. Here at Immanuel, we've decided to start a group committed to this work within our own context here in Eden Prairie and in Minnesota. We will be meeting monthly over the course of the next 9-12 months to learn together and to form our own action plans for how we might be better neighbors.
