

What are Faith Groups?

Faith Groups are small groups of people who meet on a regular basis to care for each other and encourage each other to grow in faith. Groups are formed around a common interest, stage of life, or a shared need.

What do Faith Groups do?

Faith Groups gather about once a month at a mutually agreed upon time and place. Groups decide on their own outline for meetings, but generally the time together includes:

- Caring Conversation sharing what is going on in daily life
- Devotions a short Bible study, book study or faith talk
- Service working together to serve the larger Kingdom
- Rituals and Traditions this may include a meal, a time of prayer, a shared way of beginning and ending the meeting time, etc

Who leads the Faith Groups?

Each Faith Group has a volunteer Leader who commits to helping the group find a time and place to meet, who serves as the communication link between the Faith Group and the church, and who facilitates the planning for each meeting. Most groups share the responsibility of leading the devotion or Bible Study at the monthly meeting. Resources and support are available from the Coordinator of Inreach and Outreach.

Why should I join a Faith Group?

Immanuel is a big place and there are lots of people here! While the congregation is known for being friendly, there comes a time when most people want to be known on a more intimate level by others. It is in these more personal relationships that we feel cared for and loved within the larger community. Faith Groups provide a place where people can build ongoing relationships within the congregation and give participants the opportunity to reach deeper into their faith.
